

# Retro Snowflake

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## Retro Snowflake


Retro graphic design always interests me. In fact, every time I see it I am always inspired by it. Why do I love this type of design so much? I guess for me retro design will always remind me of my childhood. I love the chic eclectic color schemes and the simple geometric designs. With that in mind, I would like to show you how to make a snowflake with a retro look. Let's get started!

### Step One: Prepare the Workspace

- Create a new 2 x 2 inch document (File > New > Blank File) at 300 ppi with a white background. (Photoshop: Choose File > New.)
- In the Menu Bar, choose View > Rulers.
- Press the letter D to reset the Color Chips to the default of black and white.

### Step Two: Create the Line


- Get the Line tool.
- In the Tool Options, set the Width to 12 px, set the Style to None, and set the Arrow Head to No Arrow Head. (Photoshop: Set the Tool Mode to Shape, the Stroke to None, and the Weight to 12 px. Open the Arrow Head Options and uncheck Start and End.)
- On the document, while holding down the Shift key, click and drag to create a line down the middle of the page about one and a half inches long. Press and hold the Space bar to reposition the line while dragging.
- In the Tool Options, click Simplify. (Photoshop: In the Menu Bar, choose Layer > Rasterize > Shape.)



### Step Three: Create the Heart Shape

- Get the Custom Shape tool.
- In the Tool Options, open the Custom Shape Picker and choose the Heart Card. If you don't see Heart Card, open the drop-down menu and choose Default Shapes. (Photoshop: Open the fly-out menu, choose Reset Shapes, and click OK.) Set the Style to None. Open the Geometry Options and choose Fixed Size. Enter a Width of 0.18 inches and a Height of 0.18 inches. (Photoshop: Set the Tool Mode to Shape and the Stroke to None.)
- On the document, click and drag to create the heart and position it at the top center of the line. See the screenshot below.
- In the Tool Options, click Simplify. (Photoshop: In the Menu Bar, choose Layer > Rasterize > Shape.)
- Press Ctrl J (Mac: Cmd J) to duplicate the heart shape.
- In the Menu Bar, choose Image > Rotate > Flip Layer Vertical. (Photoshop: In the Menu Bar, choose Edit > Transform > Flip Vertical.)


- Get the Move tool.
- On the document, click on the new heart shape and drag it to the bottom of the line shape. See the screenshot below.
- In the Layers panel, activate the top layer. Then, while holding down the Shift key, click on the bottom shape layer to activate all the shape layers.
- Press Ctrl E (Mac: Cmd E) to merge all the shape layers together.




#### **Step Four: Create the Retro Snowflake**

- Press Ctrl J (Mac: Cmd J) to duplicate the shape layer.
- Press Ctrl T (Mac: Cmd T) to get the Transform options.
- In the Tool Options, set the Angle to 30°. (Photoshop: Set the Rotation to 30°.) Click the checkmark to commit the changes.
- Press Ctrl E (Mac: Cmd E) to merge the layers together.
- Press Ctrl J (Mac: Cmd J) to duplicate the shape layer.
- Press Ctrl T (Mac: Cmd T) to get the Transform options.

- In the Tool Options, set the Angle to 60°. (Photoshop: Set the Rotation to 60°.) Click the checkmark to commit the changes.
- Press Ctrl J (Mac: Cmd J) to duplicate the top shape layer.
- Press Ctrl T (Mac: Cmd T) to get the Transform options.
- In the Tool Options, set the angle to 60°. (Photoshop: Set the rotation to 60°.) Click the checkmark to commit the changes.
- In the Layers panel, activate the top layer. Then, while holding down the Shift key, click on the bottom shape layer to activate all the shape layers.
- Press Ctrl E (Mac: Cmd E) to merge all the shape layers together.
- In the Layers panel, click on the Visibility icon of the Background layer to hide it.



Take a look at what I did with my retro snowflake design. I used it to make background paper! First, I made it into a brush. That way, it is easy for me to change the size of the element. I also reduced the Opacity of some of the snowflakes.



For any Project Life Journaling Card fans out there, I whipped up a few more examples of what you can make. I added the DS Acrylic Style to the middle card. You can also add stems to the snowflake, which turn it into a flower.
