Christmas Ornament (Photoshop Elements)

Step 1: New Document

- * Open (File > New > Blank File) a 5x5 inch document with a transparent background.
- * Click on the foreground Color Chip.
- * Choose the color you want your ornament to be. I chose #910909.



- * Click on the background Color Chip.
- * Change the color to white if it isn't already.

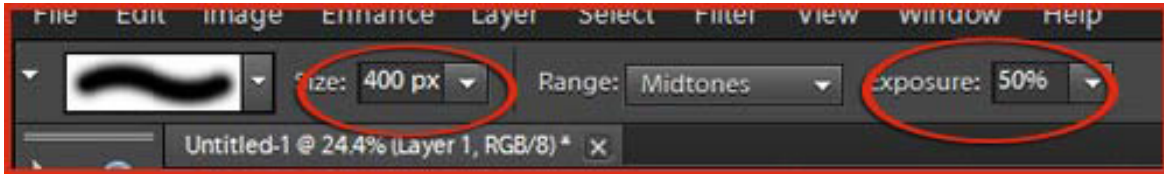
Step 2: Elliptical Marquee Tool

- * Get the Elliptical Marquee tool. It is nested with the Rectangular Marquee tool.
- * In the Options Bar choose the New Selection icon. "Feather" should be 0 px.
- * Hold down the Shift key and drag out a circle in the center of your document. Press the Space Bar to reposition while dragging.
- * Press Alt Delete (Mac: Opt Delete) to fill the circle with the Foreground color.
- * Do not deselect.

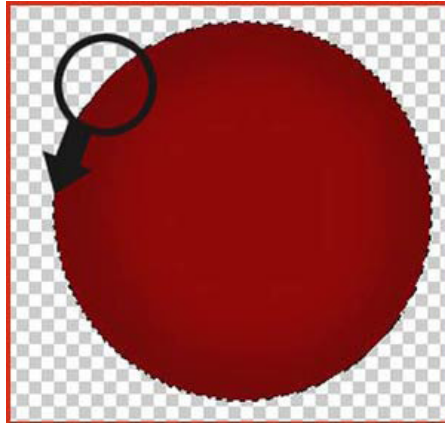
Step 3: Burn Tool

- * Get the Burn tool.

* In the Options Bar open the Brush Picker and choose a Soft Round Brush. Set the Size to 400 px, the Range to Midtones, and the Exposure to 50%.



* On the document, drag the cursor around the selection outline as shown in the screenshot below.



* In the Menu Bar choose Filter > Blur > Gaussian Blur.

o Enter 8 pixels for the Radius.

o Click OK.

* Press Ctrl D (Mac: Cmd D) to deselect.



Step 4: Add a Highlight

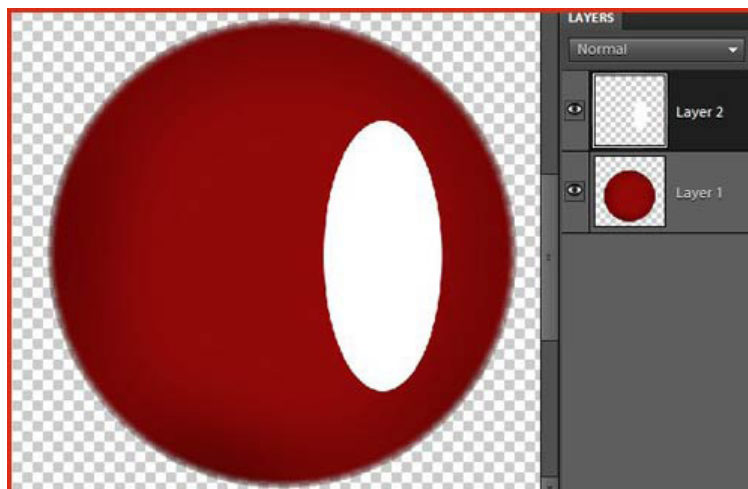
* In the Menu Bar choose Layer > New Layer.

* Get the Elliptical Marquee tool.

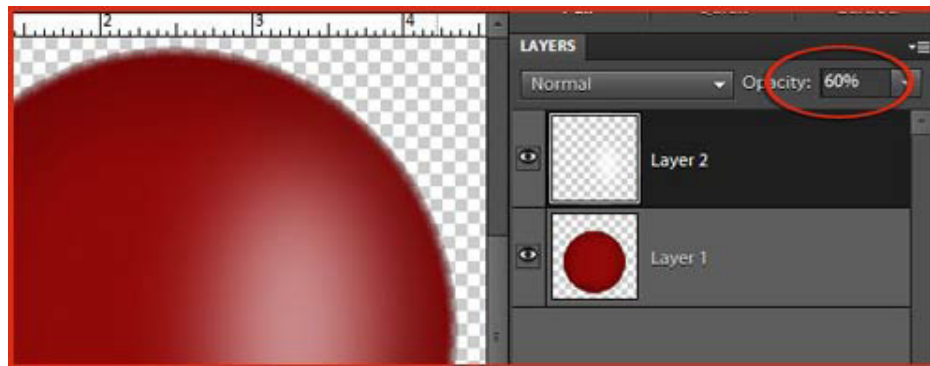
* Drag out an oval inside the ornament where the highlight would be. See the screenshot below.

* Press Ctrl Delete (Mac: Cmd Delete) to fill the oval with the background color (white).

* Press Ctrl D (Mac: Cmd D) to deselect.



- * In the Menu Bar choose Filter > Blur > Gaussian Blur.
 - o Enter 90 pixels for the Radius.
 - o Click OK.
- * In the Layers panel, change the Opacity of the highlight layer to 60%.



Step 5: Hanger

- * Download the [Digital-Scrapper-Ornament-Hanger.PNG](#) file.
- * Open (File > Open) the hanger and drag it onto the document using the Move tool.
- * Move the hanger into place like the screenshot.



Step 6: Merge and Save

- * In the Menu Bar choose Select > All Layers.
- * Choose Layer > Merge Layers.
- * Save (File > Save As) the document as a PNG file to preserve the transparent pixels.
- * Drag the ornament onto your scrapbook page.
